This past month we have been pushing forward **Welcoming City legislation** to make sure our towns and cities are safe and inclusive for all. We're **standing up for public education** funding because every child, no matter their zip code, deserves fully funded schools. And we continue with our issue campaign work making sure that our communities are empowered to resist injustice at every turn. This is what movement-building looks like — organizing, defending our neighbors, and demanding the future we deserve.

WHO KEEPS US SAFE? WE KEEP US SAFE.

This administration has shown us time and again how it seeks to attack and dehumanize our immigrant communities. But we know we are the frontlines in protecting each other. That's why we began hosting monthly in person Defense Committees across our organizing centers. We provide interpretation at our meetings.

Defense Committees provide a way for neighbors to come together, learn their rights, share information, and create action plans to resist ICE and police, staying connected through apps like Signal to respond quickly when needed.

Our first meetings, which had over 100 attendees, focused on knowing our rights and scenario-planning, Mexican Consul in Philadelphia attended to share legal services. In Reading, State Rep. Johanny Cepeda-Freytiz, State Sen. Judy Schwank, and school board member Shayka Del Rio joined to learn how they can protect and support their communities. Defense Committees prioritize Know Your Rights education, taking action and responding quickly to raids or threats.

ALLENTOWN PASSES WELCOMING ORDINANCE

Amid intensifying immigration rhetoric from the White House, on February 5th, over 150 community members took action at the local level, filling the Allentown City Council hearing to give testimony and urge council members to pass a Welcoming City Ordinance. This ordinance will limit Allentown's cooperation with ICE and was won in coalition with CAIR Philly, Lehigh SPAC, My Lehigh Valley Youth Organization, Lehigh Valley Stands Up, Muhlenberg Jewish Voice for Palestinian Liberation, and numerous other powerful community organizations.
